## What you told us about your experiences with Online Learning (April 2020)

At the end of March 2020, in response to the restrictions of the Government moving New Zealand to Covid-19 Alert Level 4, Carey moved all teaching to being fully online. From teaching week 4, all courses shifted to an entirely online format. Students were asked for their feedback on their experiences of online delivery. As of 23 April 2020, 41 students had responded to that survey. The themes and comments are summarised below.
