

In the Prophets course this week we were looking at Jeremiah's call and discussing his reluctance to take on the ministry God intended for him. This is not uncommon, in fact Moses similarly argued with God saying that he didn't know how to speak and really, God should just send someone else (Exod 4:10, 13). I suspect that many of us called into ministry feel inadequate for the task at one point or another and we can take encouragement that even those great 'heroes of the faith' questioned their ability from time to time. We often don't see ourselves as others see us, however, and when God calls He is the one who also enables. To Moses He said,

"Who gives speech to mortals? [...] Is it not I, the LORD?" (Exod 4:11)

One of the students in class also pointed out that Jeremiah must have been educated because his language in the book is so beautiful and poetic. In fact, we do know that he grew up in a priestly family and would have received training (similarly Moses would have been educated in the Egyptian court). Both aspects are in fact necessary. God gives the gifts and abilities and we need to nurture and develop them. As assignment deadlines loom, may we work hard in refining those gifts we were given and be encouraged that the Lord who calls, also enables.
