

#### Wednesday Prayer in the Chapel @ 12.40pm



In 1979 The Little River Band released a song called Cool Change. It was the kind of soft rock I grew up with; its words saying that it's time for the winds to bring a cool change from the life that was becoming normal for the author of the song.
