Easter is just around the corner. In fact, it is less than one week away!

If you are a youth pastor, or volunteer youth leader I may have just sparked a mild sense of panic as you realise how short amount of time you have left to finish filling in RAMs forms, organising tents, and sorting out transport for the various Easter Camps around the country.

Often Easter ends up being a busy time in the life of church leaders.

But it is also a time when we need to slow down, to pause, to reflect and remember.

Easter is, after all, a key moment in Christ's ministry.

At Easter time I quite often find myself listening to a 'sermon' that can be traced back to S. M. Lockridge, a prominent 20th centrury African-American preacher. I came across this particular piece many years ago through the sociologist Tony Campolo who seemed to have been so impacted by Lockridge's It's Friday, but Sunday's Coming that he used its message in numerous books and talks.

I love listening to the various versions of this Easter reflection online, and just sitting, resting, and allowing my spirit to be stirred by the sense of hope that exists because Christ's ministry doesn't end on Friday. **Sunday is coming**.
