
LIBRARY hours

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Have you seen the latest research on faith and belief in New Zealand? It was released

ast month, commissioned by the <u>Wilberforce</u> Foundation, undertaken by Australian research company <u>McCrindle</u>. It explores attitudes towards religion, spirituality and Christianity.

I love this stuff! Research like this helps clarify the picture of the state of things, which can then lead to greater and more sensible engagement.

For example, 16% of Kiwis are "Church Goers" (at least monthly), which include 9% of which are called "Active Practisers" (extremely involved with the church). This 9–16% is The Church in Aotearoa New Zealand. Is it as big/ small as you thought?

From this we could deduce that 9–16% of people in your neighbourhood, school, supermarket, movie theatre, hair salon... are part of The Church in New Zealand. This is great news! We are a significant minority, one that the whole of society might be noticing as we bring forth transformation in the various aspects of society that we linger within—because of the motivation we get from following the leader of our movement: Jesus...

The rest of the report is full of information that can be framed as motivation for us, such as: what are the biggest "faith blockers" preventing Kiwi's from engaging with Christianity? What are the generational differences to spiritual influences? What region has the most Christians?
